

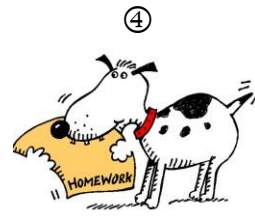
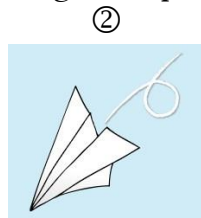
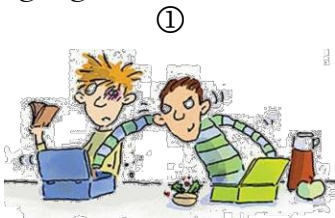
Last year I did some rotten things. This year I will be better.

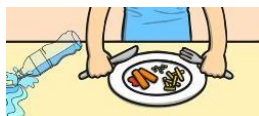

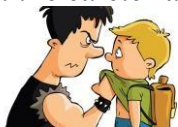
